Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope this letter finds you well. This will be the last time I fill your inbox in 2021. That said, we have been here before and the national situation remains uncertain and unclear. I will keep you updated during the holidays if anything changes and rest assured we are reviewing our contingency measures in case a quick response is required. In summary, this is what I know today.

Covid Update

<u>Boosters</u>- As we approach the winter holidays, take up of the booster jab is critical to protect everyone from serious illness and provide the best defence possible. 12-15 year olds who have not been vaccinated can book an appointment out of school on the National Booking System, and from 20th December those eligible for second doses will be also be able to book. <u>Testing</u>- All education staff and students of secondary age and above should continue to test, and importantly report those test results, twice-weekly.

<u>Daily testing for contacts of COVID-19</u>-from 14th December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 has been introduced. All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to 18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take an LFD test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating.

Once notified by Test and Trace (NOT the school) as a close contact, all students are strongly recommended to take a LFD each day for 7 days and report the results through the <u>online reporting system</u> and to their setting. If they test negative, they can continue to attend their education setting. Outside of the education setting, they should continue to follow <u>national guidance</u>. This approach should also be adopted over the Christmas holiday and on return in January.

January examinations

There are external exams for vocational and technical qualifications timetabled for January. Students who are due to sit these exams will be prepared and it is right that they should be given every opportunity to demonstrate what they have learnt. **Exams and formal assessments will go ahead**. Consequently, it is essential that students continue to prepare for these assessments.

- Parents parked on double yellow lines, often obscuring views
- Fear of an accident given current weather conditions and all of the above.

Newcastle City Council will be providing parking enforcement officers to monitor the area and where necessary issue tickets.
