### History

### Skills

The GCSE course allows students to develop a number of skills which are essential to fully understand and engage with the study of History. For example:

- Students will develop a secure understanding of chronology, knowledge and understanding of history on different scales and contexts.
- Students apply historical concepts and processes and engage with the nature of evidence and interpretation.
- Students will engage with a variety of perspectives, such as political, social and economic, and investigate the contributions of key individuals and groups. In this way students will be able to draw parallels and make links between the distinct areas of study.

### <u>Assessment</u>

This linear GCSE course from AQA is examined entirely by examination at the end of Year 11. There are 2 papers, each equally weighted:

- Paper 1 The USA 1920-1973 and the Cold War 1945-1972
- Paper 2 The History of Medicine 1000 to the present day and Norman England c.1066 c. 1100
