- Students are allowed to leave site after break but we expect exemplary behaviour in the community



Behaviour and other routines

- Pyramid Code applies for those that need additional support to manage their time and independent learning
- Lockers: pay online now key distribution end of September
- ID badges must be worn at all times & students swipe in and out when entering or leaving school
- No phones out except in Sixth Form spaces: expect them to be confiscated (returned at 3.30 that day)
- Independent Learner Award



Silent Study and Interventions

- Silent study: period 1 & 2 each day
- Students may only leave site after break (extended to end of period 3 in run up to exams)
- Interventions take place for selected students on main school review days
- Staff also offer revision and booster classes, sometimes in holidays as well as after school



Medication and First Aid

- Prescription medication stored/issued from First Aid room opposite Main School Student Reception
- Students may carry and administer their own medication



Visitors

- Parents or other visitors should make an appointment if they want a face to face meeting
- Please sign in at main reception when you arrive at school for a meeting
- During review days, we ask you to meet your son or daughter in main reception before attending the review appointment



Attendance

- Good attendance is crucial to maximise chances of success
- Parents to ring the Sixth Form absence line each day: 2559040
- Medical appointments etc note to tutor in advance
- Authorisation of absence is at the principal's discretion
- Absence below for students below 90% will not be authorised unless we have medical evidence
- Traffic light letters keep you up to date with attendance
- Parents can also see attendance & other data through School Gateway
- Detention will run for those with poor punctuality
- Independent Learner Award must be above 95%



Why is good attendance important?

Year 12 End of Year Key In:

- No students with attendance above 96% were predicted below a C grade
- 9% of students with attendance 90-95% were predicted D-U
- 28% of students with attendance below 90% were predicted D-U
- 91% of students with attendance above 96% were predicted $A^{\ast}\text{-}B$
- 69% of students with attendance 90-95% were predicted A*-B
- 47% of students with attendance below 90% were predicted A*-B



Year 12 End of Year Key In

- The average grade for students with attendance above 95% was A
- The average grade for students with attendance of 90-95% was B
- The average grade for students with attendance below 90% was C
