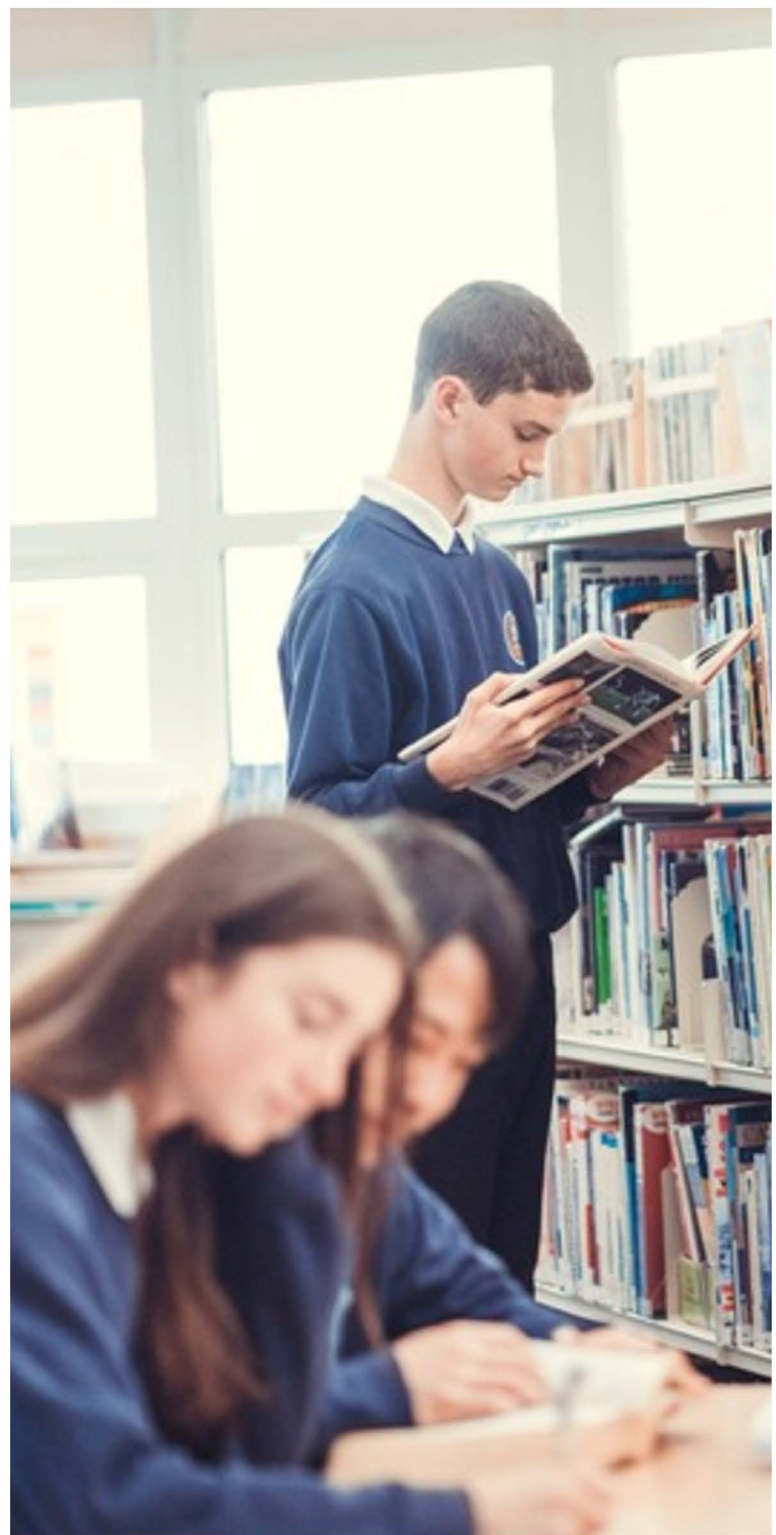

Transition from Middle School

From Middle School transition through to our students leaving us at the end of Year 13, Gosforth Academy provides a caring and nurturing environment. The transition from middle school to high school can be a daunting journey, but we ensure this vital transition is as smooth as possible.

Middle-High Liaison meetings take place throughout the academic year, across all departments, including SENDCO meetings. Our transition programme includes the Heads of Year visiting the middle schools to meet the students and transition days at the academy for the students to experience the travelling to and from school as well as lessons, in preparation for them starting in September.

Students follow the National Curriculum in KS3. They study, English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, Religious Studies, PE, IT, Art, Technology, PSCHE, Modern Foreign Languages, Drama and Music.

Our PRAISE Code ensures that student achievements in class are recognised through the awarding of stamps, which enables students to access our reward programme.

We hold a Sports Awards Evening celebrating the students who have represented the academy throughout the academic year. Throughout the year, there is a wide range of events to show our appreciation of students, both public and private, formal and informal.



Curriculum

Our Curriculum in Year 9 is designed to remain as broad as possible, for as long as possible. We deliver a range of subjects that go beyond the National Curriculum, ensuring that the interests, abilities and passions of the students in our large cohorts are reflected in what they study. Effective transition and liaison with the middle schools is also a vital component of this model.

We are also clear that there is a need to equip our students with a varied range of experiences across subjects. Students will therefore study a broad and balanced curriculum, involving 16 different subjects across the two-week cycle. These will also be supplemented by two PRAISE lessons, which enable the delivery of the Assembly Programme, Character Education, and various other Personal Development opportunities.

We will ask students for their preferences with regard to two elements of their study – their second language and their preferred Enrichment activities.

Before students begin their GCSE studies, they are carefully guided in their subject choices that allows them to maximise their potential. This secures their success and prepares them for transition into the Sixth Form.

Dedicated Support Team

The academy's aim is to provide a safe and secure environment for your child to develop and fulfil their potential academically and pastorally. One of the strengths of the academy is that students receive outstanding pastoral and educational advice. The pastoral team, alongside the Inclusion team, will support your child in their transition from middle school to high school. The pastoral team will monitor your child's welfare, progress, engagement for learning, attendance and punctuality. In the first instance, you should contact the pastoral office.

Form Tutors see the students in their care every morning and expert support for those who need it comes from our school counsellors, school nurse service or other outside agencies.

Both pastoral and SEND staff are dedicated in working with young people and their families to ensure that they make the best possible progress.
